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THE CONCEPTION OF MARY (v.18)

THE REACTION OF JOSEPH (v.19)

- 1. Joseph planned, out of kindness, to quietly "divorce" Mary.
- 2. Mary had been told by an angel (see Luke 1:30-37) and had likely told Joseph.

THE COMMUNICATION OF AN ANGEL (v.20-21)

- 1. "Don't be afraid; go ahead and marry Mary."
- 2. "Name the baby 'Jesus', because He will save His people....
- 3. ...from their sins." What is "sin"?

THE ASSOCIATION WITH AN OLD TESTAMENT TEXT (v.22-23)

- 1. Why is the name in the quotation "Immanuel", but the angel said Mary's baby's name was to be "Jesus"?
 - a) Context of the Old Testament quotation. The child, Immanuel, was to be a sign to King Ahaz that God would be with him.
 - b) Meaning of "fulfilled": filled full, fleshed out, made complete. See Galatians 5:14 and Romans 15:14
- 2. <u>Point:</u> The child in Isaiah's day, Immanuel, was "God with us" in name only, a sign of <u>physical</u> deliverance. But the child born to Mary, named Jesus (not Immanuel) is "God with us" in <u>reality</u>, bringing eventual <u>spiritual</u> deliverance.

THE REACTION OF JOSEPH, PART 2 (v.24-25)

Joseph did what God said to do:

he married Mary;

he named Jesus, Jesus.

RAMIFICATIONS/IMPLICATIONS-----TAKE-HOME LESSONS

- 1. It's not the norm for God to speak to us in dreams, but He <u>has</u> spoken <u>clearly</u> and <u>sufficiently</u>, in Scripture.
- 2. "God with us" proves it makes sense to trust God, like Joseph and Mary did, even in painful and/or unlikely situations.
- 3. Confidence about our eventual <u>future</u> salvation (being eternally with the Lord in the life to come) can have a decisive impact on us in our <u>present</u> life.
- 4. "God with us" demonstrates that God is true to His Word.
